

Devotion Guidelines: 1. Keep it short and interactive

- 2. Read the Scripture passage together with each person reading a verse
- 3. Ask questions about each verse
- 4. Ask each child how they will apply what they have learned from the verses. (Even your young children) You, as a parent, also share what you will apply. Remember that Bible study is for application and transformation not just for information.)
- 5. Pray together as a family (You and your children can take turns praying) - For each other's requests
- To ask for God's help to apply what you have learned

Read Together: Colossians 4:2-6

2 Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving; 3 praying at the same time for us as well, that God will open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned; 4 that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak. 5 Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity. 6 Let your speech always be with grace, as though seasoned with salt, so that you will know how you should respond to each person.

Talk Together:

In verse 2, how should we pray?
In verse 3-4, what should we pray for?
In verses 5, why should we act wisely towards others?
In verse 6, how should we speak to other people?

Conviction:

I will live a life of prayer and respond to others with grace.

Application: How will you apply this lesson to your life?

Pray Together:

Dear Lord, help us to lead a life of prayer and thanksgiving. Empower us with your Holy Spirit to be a blessing and a positive influence to the people around us. In Jesus' name, Amen.



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
