WELCOME

Share a recent situation in your life where you have seen God's hand at work in a way that you never expected Him to.

WORD

GENESIS 50:20

As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good in order to bring about this present result, to preserve many people alive.

Like the goal of a jigsaw puzzle, we all want to see the complete picture whenever we face problems. But more often than not, when we look at our situation, what we see are missing pieces - questions like "Why is this happening to me? What's going to happen? How long is this going to take? These are the missing pieces of life's puzzle that we usually struggle with. As we look at the life of Joseph in the Old Testament, we can learn that amidst these questions – God is sovereign, God is good, so we should trust Him.

There are four places where's Joseph's character was tested, sculpted, and built by God.

THE PIT (READ GENESIS 37:2-11, 18-24)

Joseph's brothers hated him because he was his father's favorite. Though this was not Joseph's fault, his brothers regarded him as an enemy (Genesis 37:2-4). His brothers hated him all the more when he shared with them his dream about their sheaves bowing down to his (**Genesis 37:5-8**). It was such a serious matter that they plotted to kill Joseph (**Genesis 37:18-20**). Fortunately, one of his brothers, Reuben, talked them out of it. Instead, they stripped Joseph of his tunic and threw him into the pit (**Genesis 37:23-24**). Ancient cisterns or pits were around were around 15 to 20 feet deep, with an opening of only two to three feet wide. Without water, the bottom of the pit would be full of mire - stinking mud. This must have been a very scary time for young Joseph. We do not know what Joseph did while in the pit but we can learn from David in Psalm 30:8-9. When we feel that we are in a pit, we should pray to the God who is both sovereign and good.

THE PRIVATE ROOM (READ GENESIS 39:1-12)

Joseph was sold to some traders who eventually brought him to Egypt. He became a successful man under Potiphar, a powerful and wealthy official, because the Lord was with him (**Genesis 39:1-6**). Trust and wait on God and do our best at all times. God is with us even in the darkest moments. He is faithful and He will never leave nor forsake us.

Joseph was handsome (**Genesis 39:6**) and Potiphar's wife wanted him to lie with her. Joseph refused because ultimately, he knows he was accountable to God. He fled from sexual immorality. He knew he was a recipient of God's grace and he wanted to honor and glorify Him (**Genesis 39:7-12**).

THE PRISON (READ GENESIS 39:16-23)

Joseph was falsely accused and put into prison (Genesis **39:16-20**). But the Lord was with him and once again, he gained favor in the eyes the chief jailer (Genesis 39:21-23). Again, we see the presence of God in the life of Joseph and this is a reminder for us that He is right there in the "prisons" of our lives.

THE PALACE (READ GENESIS 41:39-43; 42:1-3, 6, 8; 45:4-5, 7-8)

In God's perfect time, Joseph goes from prison to the palace. When God makes His move, we will just be so amazed! We have to trust that He is doing something on our behalf. Joseph was now second in command to Pharaoh (**Genesis 41:39-43**). Meanwhile, because of the famine, Joseph's family was looking for grain (**Genesis 42:1-2**) and they met Joseph in Egypt (**Genesis 42:6, 8**). This was literally Joseph's dream come true! But Joseph's perspective has totally changed. As he trusted God throughout his trials, he

understood more and more that God is both sovereign and good. God had an amazing plan for Joseph and for the nation of Israel (**Genesis 45:4-5, 7-8**).

After their father Israel died, the brothers were again afraid that Joseph may avenge himself. But Joseph's perspective never changed (**Genesis 50:20**). He knew it was God who sent him to Egypt to preserve the nation of Israel. God is indeed sovereign and He is good. If we believe this, how can we not respond in total trust to Him.
