BIG IDEA

REMINDERS IN USING THIS GUIDE

LEAD your children:

1. Look up and read the passage of Scripture. Then read out loud to your children
2. Emphasize the Big Idea and memorize the verse by taking turns.
3. Ask a few questions along the way of the discussion but focus more on the questions provided.
4. Do a fun and meaningful activity and more importantly, work on the application together.

OBJECTIVE

To cause the students to learn that God blesses and protects us when we obey.

READ: GENESIS 6:9-7:12

WORDS TO REMEMBER:

Ark: the first word "ark". In our Bible story, God told someone to build an "ark". An ark is a big boat.

Flood: a flood happens when land gets covered with a lot of water. When it rains for a long time, sometimes we have a flood.

A big flood happened in our Bible story today.

Obedience: simply means carrying out or following the wise directions of those who are responsible for you.

1. God commanded children to honor and obey their parents in Ephesians 6:1-3 and Colossians 3:20. How do you model this to your children with your own parents?
2. How intentional have you been in teaching your children to be obedient to God and you? Are your children able to catch this godly attitude because of your influence? If not, what steps will you take to be more intentional?
3. If you haven't been a good model especially when it comes to honoring your own parents and treating your family members lovingly, would you need to admit, ask for forgiveness, and correct it?

temple: it is a building devoted to the worship, or regarded as the dwelling place

lie down: it is an act of resting in a flat position

listening: it is an act of paying attention on what someone is saying; to hear what someone has said

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

1. What is your communication style, to Lecture or to Listen?
2. What prevents you, as a parent, from listening more to your kids? What changes will you make to become a better listener?
3. How available are you on a scale of 1-10 (10 is extremely available and 1 is extremely absent) to talk and listen with your spouse and your children?

mother-in-law - is the mother of someone's wife or husband. In our story, Naomi became the mother in law of Orpah and Ruth when the two ladies married Naomi's sons

daughter-in-law - is the wife of someone's sons. When your son, marries a woman. That woman becomes a daughter in law. Just like in our story, Naomi's two sons made Orpah and Ruth their wives. Orpah and Ruth became Naomi's daughters in law

3. In what ways can you be like Ruth to God, your parents, and other members of your family?

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

1. Ruth and Naomi had built their relationship as family even during difficult times. What were those moments where God made your family stronger and more committed to each other?
2. Do you intentionally make ways to improve your relationship with your spouse and kids? Do your family members feel like you prioritize them? Why or why not?
3. What adjustments will you make in your schedule to be able to spend time with your family members?

WORDS TO REMEMBER:

dream— a series of thoughts, visions, or feelings that happen during sleep.

pits— a large, deep hole in the ground.

ruler of Egypt— a person who has authority to rule in Egypt. An example of a ruler of Egypt is a Pharaoh.

FORGIVENESS

Clearing the record of those who have wronged me and not holding a grudge.

THIS WEEK, I WILL:

- be quick to forgive.
- not cover up my own wrongs but will
- be quick to ask for forgiveness.
- not seek revenge.
- respond kindly to those who hurt me.
- not take up offenses for others.

QUESTIONS FOR KIDS:

1. How did Joseph respond to the hurt caused by his brothers on him?
2. Are there people who have hurt you? Have you forgiven them already?
3. If yes, what made you decide to forgive them? If you haven't forgiven them, what is stopping you from forgiving them? **Why do you think God sent Jesus, His Son to die on the cross?**
4. Knowing that God has forgiven you of your sins through Jesus's death and resurrection, what specific thing will you do this week to show your thanks to Him?

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

1. What makes you want to be actively involved and enter the world of your family members? Why do you think this is necessary?
2. As we continue to build relationships in our family and enter their world, there are times when we also need to restore them. Is there anyone in the family that you need to forgive? Will you forgive him/her by the grace of God?
3. Is there anyone in the family that you need to ask for forgiveness? Then ask for forgiveness. You may use these questions
 - a. How can I improve?
 - b. How have I hurt or disappointed you?
 - c. Will you please forgive me?

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MEMORY VERSE:

"Encourage one another."
1 THESSALONIANS 5:11A

BIG IDEA:

"God makes me strong."

OBJECTIVE

To cause the students to know that God makes us strong so we can sincerely encourage others.

READ: JOSHUA 1:1-9

WORDS TO REMEMBER:

encourage - to give courage, to help

be strong - to be strong is to stand firm. This means you are not affected by what others say or do. Obey completely what God tells you to do

be courageous - the Greek word translated "courage" and "good cheer" means literally "boldness and confidence." In the Bible, courage is the opposite of fear. When God commands us to fear not, to be of good cheer, and to have courage, He is always commanding against fear, which is the opposite of courage. (Source: <https://www.gotquestions.org/Bible-courage.html>)

2. How did God encourage Joshua? What were God's promises to him that made him become strong and courageous?
3. Who in your family needs encouragement today? How will you encourage them?

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

1. Of the many words you speak in a day, what percentage are life-giving words that build up others, and what percentage are death words that tear down and hurt others?
2. Do you always affirm your family members? What changes will you make to see the gifts and abilities in your children and spouse?
3. Affirm and encourage your family members today. Give statements that affirm the potential of each other. Then pray for one another.

father, son - "**Father**" means a man who has a child, "**son**" means a male child

1. How do you respond when your parents discipline you? Do you think the way you respond to discipline pleases the Lord?
2. Why does the Lord discipline His children? Why do your parents discipline you?
3. What will you do the next time your parents correct or discipline you?

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

1. How were you trained to obey as a child? Do you sometimes find yourself doing the same way of disciplining your own child/ children? Have you ever evaluated your way of disciplining your child as something pleasing or not pleasing to God?
2. What do you think motivates your child/ children to obey you? What do you think makes it difficult for him/ her/ them to obey you? Are there attitudes and behaviors that you yourself need to surrender to the Lord to become good model to your child/ children?
3. As parents, how will you discipline your child/ children to train them to become more like Christ; obedient to you as based on His Word, and so, experience the blessing that God has promised?

WORDS TO REMEMBER:

test - In our Bible story, God made his friend, Abraham go through a very difficult test. God wanted to be sure if Abraham really loved God so God tested Abraham if he would obey God. Abraham had to choose if he would obey God or save his one and only son, Isaac. Abraham had a very difficult choice to make. It was not an easy test for Abraham

offer - God asked Abraham to give him Isaac, Abraham's only son. To **offer is an act of worship** that Abraham needed to do to prove how much he loves and obey God

ram - A ram is a male (boy sheep). During the time of Abraham, the people usually offer rams or boy sheep. A boy sheep is called a ram

1. How do you show trust in something or someone?
2. What was God requiring of Abraham that needed Abraham's complete trust in Him?
3. Is there anything that God is asking you to do today which requires your complete trust in Him?

QUESTIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

1. How does your view of God impact your life on how you trust and obey Him?
2. Have you entrusted your kids fully to the Lord's care? Was it easy? Why or why not?
3. How often do you pray for your family members that they will experience more of who God is? What specifically do you want to pray for them today?
