READ IT!

EXODUS 17:8-16

⁸Then Amalek came and fought against Israel at Rephidim. 9So Moses said to Joshua, "Choose men for us and go out, fight against Amalek. Tomorrow I will station myself on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." ¹⁰Joshua did just as Moses told him, and fought against Amalek; and Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill. 11So it came about, when Moses held his hand up, that Israel prevailed: but when he let his hand down. Amalek prevailed. 12 And Moses' hands were heavy. So they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it: and Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other. So his hands were steady until the sun set. 13And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword. 14Then the Lord said to Moses, "Write this in a book as a memorial and recite it to Joshua, that I will utterly wipe out the memory of Amalek from under heaven." 15And Moses built an altar and named it The Lord is My Banner: 16 and he said, "Because the Lord has sworn, the Lord will have war against Amalek from generation to generation."

POINT IT OUT!

1. OUR ENEMIES

(Exodus 17:8; Deuteronomy 25:17-18)

- Amalek" who used to refer to an individual who descended from Esau, and here Amalek refers to a people group, his descendants.
- Israel's first official enemy on the way to the Promised Land.
- They were described as ruthless and merciless, attacking the most vulnerable among the Israelites

In the Bible, three enemies of God's people are pointed out:

The World -- aspect of the world, society, or environment which tends to lure us away from God and his ways (1 John 2:16; John 16:33)

The Flesh -- our sinful nature; our tendency to give in to temptation or things that God doesn't want us to do (Galatians 5:17).

The Devil -- explicitly is an "adversary"— the accuser of the brethren. He is also a supernatural enemy. We are not able to do battle with him in our own strength but God's (1 Peter 5:8; Ephesians 6:12).

2. OUR RESPONSE

(Exodus 17:9-10; Exodus 4:1-2; Exodus 17:11; Exodus 17:12-13)

- We are not just to surrender to the enemy. We have a part to play in this battle.
- The way that we wage war in this battle in our lives is supernatural.
- Moses' staff had no magical powers, but a picture of how a supernatural, all-powerful God can do amazing things through ordinary people with ordinary resources.
- We should be dependent in our prayer, worship, and daily walk with God.





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- "Aaron and Hur supported his hands" also show how we can support one another.
- Many "one another" verses in the Bible (e.g. Galatians 6:2, 1 Thessalonians 5:11, James 5:16, and John 13:34).
- In general, we are meant to respond to our enemies in prayer, worship, and in supporting one another.
- Specific ways to respond to our enemies:

The World (1 John 2:15): Do not worship nor crave the things of the world. Love God alone. The best expression of our love for God is through our life by keeping his commands (John14:15).

The Flesh (Ephesians 5:18): We must practice the Spirit-filled life — the greatest secret of the Christian life.

The Devil (James 4:7-8a) - "Submit" or come under the authority of God. "Resist" the devil in the power of the Holy Spirit. "Come close to God"; spend time in His Word. Let Him speak to you as you speak to Him.

3. GOD'S PROMISES

(Exodus 17:14; Genesis 3:21; Revelation 13:8; 1 Peter 1:18-20; John 8:57-59; 1 Chronicles 4:42-43)

In the final part of the story, God told Moses to write His promise. The enemies will not have the final say. God will have the final victory.

• Specific promises God made about our enemies.

The World (John 16:33) - We who trusted Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior are sure to live in a place where these troubles and enemies no longer exist.

The Flesh (Galatians 5:16) - God promises that we will not carry out the desires of the flesh if we live a Spirit-filled life.

The Devil (Revelation 20:10) - Someday, God will deal a final blow to the ultimate enemy of our lives and he will be in the lake of fire and brimstone forever.

The Final Enemy: Death (1 Corinthians 15:26, 50-55)

Believing Jesus as our Lord and Savior assures us that this world is not our home and when we experience the final victory over death, we will be with Jesus forever. Surrender your life to Jesus now!
