PREPARING FOR LIFE'S BATTLES

LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

In the book of Joshua chapter 5, the Israelites are getting ready for their first battle inside the Promised Land after crossing the Jordan River. There are four experiences that God brought the Israelites and Joshua through to get them battle-ready. These experiences can also teach us principles that will prepare us for life's challenges.

CONSECRATION: "THE LORD IS MY MASTER!" (JOSHUA 5:1-9)

Consecration is a key factor in preparing for life's battles, as it involves dedicating oneself completely to the service and worship of God. It involves unconditional surrender to God and is a demonstration of one's belief in God's sovereignty and mastery over their life. Consecration is symbolized by the covenant of circumcision, which was a sign of a person belonging to God and being set apart for His purposes. Circumcision was not just a physical act — it also symbolized the cutting away of sinful and worldly ways, and a circumcision of the heart. The key to victory in life's battles is to surrender. It is by surrendering oneself to God that we can tap into His power and strength. Furthermore, when we consecrate ourselves to God, it brings us into a close relationship with Him, where we can receive His guidance, provision, and protection.

CELEBRATION: "THE LORD IS MY SAVIOR!" (JOSHUA 5:10)

While in Gilgal, the Israelites celebrated the Passover, a significant event celebrated by the new generation who had dedicated themselves to the Lord. God's timing was perfect as He led them to the Promised Land just in time for the Passover celebration, fulfilling His command in Exodus 12:1-7. The lamb that was sacrificed during the Passover symbolizes Jesus, our Passover Lamb, as noted in Matthew 26:2, John 1:29, and 1 Corinthians 5:7. Today, we commemorate Jesus' sacrifice through the Lord's Supper, which reminds us of His death on the cross to forgive our sins. This celebration prepares us for the ultimate battle (death), and those who trust in Jesus as their Savior can look forward to an eternal, joyful existence in God's presence.

CONFIDENCE: "THE LORD IS MY PROVIDER!" (JOSHUA 5:11-12)

In Joshua 5, the Israelites are given confidence to face life's battles through their experience of God's provision. God provides food from the land to the new generation of Israelites after the first Passover celebration and stops their supply of manna the next day (v. 11-12). This was meant to show the Israelites that they need more than just physical food to live — they also need God and His word (Deuteronomy 8:2-3). This experience of God's provision taught the Israelites that they can trust God to provide for all their needs. In the same way, when we experience God's provision in our own lives, it gives us confidence to face other battles. For example, if we trust in God during a time of need, such as during a pandemic, and He provides for us, it can help us have the confidence to face other challenges that come our way. We can trust that God will continue to provide for us, just as He did for the Israelites.

COMPLETE OBEDIENCE: "THE LORD IS MY COMMANDER!" (JOSHUA 5:13-15)

When the Lord is your commander, it means you will obey His every command and accept whatever He allows. Joshua encountered this principle as they approached Jericho (vv. 13-15). He was confronted by a mysterious being who identified themselves as the captain of the LORD's army. Joshua fell on his face, and took off his sandals when commanded to, recognizing that he was in a holy place in that encounter. It is highly likely that Joshua came face-toface with Jesus Himself! Joshua realized that he was before a holy God, and he had to humble himself and submit his heart to God before receiving any commands.

By consecrating ourselves to God, celebrating His sacrifice, having confidence in His provision, and being completely obedient to His commands, we will be prepared to face life's battles. The Lord is our Master, Savior, Provider, and Commander, and with Him, we will experience victory.
