

Be a Changemaker: Be Selfless!

LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

In the Book of Ruth, we encounter three individuals – Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz – who made a significant impact through their selflessness one life at a time. Chapter 1 introduces us to Elimelech and his wife Naomi, who fled the famine in Israel to seek refuge in Moab with their two sons. The sons married Moabite women, Orpah and Ruth. Tragically, Naomi became a widow, losing both her sons and finding herself with no means of support except for her daughters-in-law. When Naomi heard that the Lord had provided food for His people in Israel, she made the decision to return home.

THE PERSEVERANCE OF NAOMI

As Naomi prepared to go back to Judah, she advised her daughters-in-law to return to their own families (v.8). Naomi's concern was for Ruth and Orpah to find new husbands and security in their homeland (v.9). Like us, Naomi struggled when faced with challenging circumstances, even though she knew God is good and loving. She offered a practical solution to their dire situation, suggesting that they return to their former gods (v.15). Naomi felt the weight of God's hand upon her and perceived her situation as more hopeless than that of the two younger women (vv.12-13). Naomi, being human, provided a human-centered solution to their predicament. Nevertheless, she still believed in God and returned to Him. Despite her imperfect approach, God used her to draw Ruth to faith in Him. It is a reminder that God works through flawed individuals.

THE SACRIFICE OF RUTH

Selflessness is not easy—it requires effort. We witness Ruth's response to Naomi (Ruth 1:16-17), where she vowed to remain by Naomi's side no matter what. This exemplifies loyalty and sacrifice, as Ruth knew that upon returning to Israel, she would likely face the challenges of being a foreigner and the unlikelihood of marrying again. Ruth also chose Naomi's God, Yahweh, to be her own.

Upon returning to Israel, Ruth took up gleaning in the harvest fields, and God's care for her becomes evident (Ruth 2:2-3). She found herself gleaning in a field owned by one of Naomi's relatives, and although God's

name is not explicitly mentioned, His guiding hand is unmistakable. Boaz, the field's owner, took notice of Ruth (Ruth 2:4-7) and showed her kindness without any expectation of reciprocation. He referred to her as "my daughter," indicating a significant age difference, and ensured her protection while working alongside his servants (Ruth 2:8-10). When Ruth questioned Boaz's kindness, he affirmed that her selfless actions on behalf of Naomi were well-known. Ruth's decision to follow Yahweh by accompanying Naomi led her to experience God's providence in Boaz's field, which in turn instilled hope in Naomi.

THE GRACE OF BOAZ

Naomi instructed Ruth on how to approach Boaz as a "kinsman-redeemer" (Ruth 3:1-4), and Ruth obediently followed her instructions (vv. 5-13). Ruth implored Boaz to rescue her, and he acknowledged her great kindness in doing so. Boaz revealed that there was a closer relative who could redeem Ruth but promised that if the other man declined, he would fulfill the role (Ruth 3:12-13, Leviticus 25:25). Essentially, he assured Ruth that he had it covered and would follow God's way.

Boaz exhibited nobility, grace, and generosity. He engaged in conversation with the closer relative, but when the relative declined to redeem Ruth, he became her kinsman-redeemer, and Ruth became his wife (Ruth 4:1-10). Boaz displayed kindness not only to Ruth but also to his workers, aligning his actions with the Lord's instructions on caring for the poor. He demonstrated great compassion and generosity without expecting anything in return. Boaz redeemed Elimelech's legacy at his own expense, choosing not to take shortcuts but instead following God's ways.

The story reaches a happy ending: Ruth became truly valuable not only to Naomi but also to Israel as the ancestor of King David and, ultimately, Jesus (Ruth 4:13-22, Matthew 1:5-6a). God is our true Redeemer, and through Jesus, we find redemption.
