TO FINISH WELL, KEEP ON GROWING

LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

We all experience setbacks and disappointments in different areas of life, such as exams, jobs, businesses, or relationships with our families. When failure happens, it's easy to feel discouraged and lose hope. We might even start believing the lies that tell us we're defined by our failures and that success is out of reach. But if we want to finish well, we must reject these lies and commit ourselves to a journey of continuous growth and improvement.

In his letter, Peter offers us valuable wisdom and encouragement. In 2 Peter 3:17-18, he urges us to stay vigilant and keep growing in our faith. To overcome these challenges, we need to be intentional about our growth and take active steps to nurture our faith.

Peter's encounter with Jesus in Luke 5:1-18 shows us the transformative power of growth. Peter, an experienced fisherman, had spent all night fishing without success. But when Jesus told him to try again, despite his doubts, Peter obeyed. The result was an astonishing catch of fish that amazed him. This encounter deeply impacted Peter and made him realize the greatness of Jesus. It was a turning point that led Peter to leave everything behind and follow Him, embarking on a journey of faith characterized by growth and transformation.

GROW FROM YOUR FAILURES

Peter experienced both remarkable successes and significant failures during his time with Jesus. He walked on water, recognized Jesus as the Christ, and witnessed incredible events like the Transfiguration. However, he also faced rebuke from Jesus and infamously denied knowing Him three times. But Peter didn't let his failures define him. He understood that failure is not the end. In Christ, there is always hope for redemption and growth. By acknowledging our weaknesses and relying on God's strength, we can overcome our failures and continue to grow.

GROW IN HUMILITY

Peter struggled with pride throughout his journey with Jesus. He often overestimated his own strength and underestimated his weaknesses. For instance, when Jesus predicted that all the disciples would abandon Him, Peter confidently declared that he would never do so. Yet, when put to the test, Peter denied Jesus just as He had said. This humbling experience taught Peter the importance of humility and the dangers of pride. Similarly, we should be aware of any signs of pride within ourselves and continually seek God's help to cultivate a humble heart.

GROW BY GOD'S GRACE

Growth in our lives is a result of God's grace. Jesus has the power to redeem even the most challenging and chaotic seasons of our lives. In 1 Corinthians 15:10, Paul emphasizes that it is by God's grace that we can grow, thrive, and serve Him. This grace enables us to learn from our failures, grow in humility, and persevere in our journey of faith. Just as Jesus appeared to His disciples after His resurrection, offering them peace, He extends the same peace and restoration to us. He desires to perfect, confirm, strengthen, and establish us (1 Peter 5:10) as we continue to grow in His grace.

As we strive to finish well by continually growing, let's remember Peter's example. Just like Simon encountered Jesus and witnessed a miracle at the Sea of Galilee, we too can have meaningful encounters with Christ in our own lives. Through these encounters, we can experience His transformative power and be inspired to pursue growth. By relying on God's grace, humbly learning from our failures, and trusting in His guidance, we can live lives that honor and glorify Him. May our ultimate goal be to hear our Master's commendation, "Well done, good and faithful servant," as we strive to finish well in our journey of faith (Matthew 25:21).
