

SURRENDER YOUR RIGHTS

LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

How do you feel about surrendering your rights? Surrendering our rights means we are choosing to love God and others in our response even if it looks like we are on the losing end. Sometimes, because of our knowledge, we feel we have the right to be right. But in 1 Corinthians 8 and 9, the apostle Paul shares how and why we are actually on the winning end when we surrender our rights.

TO BUILD OTHERS UP (1 Corinthians 8:1-3)

Paul tells the Corinthian church about the delicate balance between knowledge and love. He acknowledges the value of knowledge but warns against the arrogance it can breed (1 Corinthians 8:1). Knowledge, while not inherently negative, can become destructive when it leads to pride, tearing others down instead of uplifting them. Paul emphasizes that the right kind of knowledge, one coupled with love, is transformative and enriching (1 Timothy 1:5, 1 Corinthians 13:1-2). It should inspire believers to follow Christ and help others do the same.

To build others up, we must do so in love. To those who will listen, we must **TEACH IT**. To those who will argue, we must **SEEK TO UNDERSTAND**. To those who will disagree, we must **LEARN TO BE GRACIOUS**. Ultimately, Paul emphasizes that in our love for God, what truly matters is not just knowledge but being known by God personally (1 Corinthians 8:3).

TO PROTECT OTHERS (1 Corinthians 8:4-13)

In Paul's time, debates revolved around three practices: observing Jewish holidays, drinking wine, and consuming meat sacrificed to idols (v.4). One faction believed that eating such meat equated to idol worship. Paul clarified that there are no other gods but the one true God (v.5-6). Today, we wrestle with similar questions (such as alcohol consumption, attire, entertainment choices, etc.) Some believers possess a "weak" conscience, easily stumbling when others engage in specific activities around them (v.7-

8). Therefore, those of us who feel liberated in such matters must be cautious not to cause others to falter (v.9-10).

It is crucial for all Christians to grow in maturity. The less mature ("weak") believers need to mature in their understanding, while the more mature ones should support and uplift them, as emphasized in Romans 14:1-3. To protect our fellow believers, it is paramount to abstain from doing any action that could cause them to stumble, even if it might not affect one personally (v.13). By embracing this principle, the Christian community fosters an environment of empathy, selflessness, and love, ensuring that all members grow together in spiritual maturity. "In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity and love."

FOR THE GOSPEL (1 Corinthians 9)

In 1 Corinthians 9, Paul recognizes the "rights" he has as an apostle but chooses not to exercise them fully. He presents five compelling reasons why he has the right to certain privileges as an apostle: common practices, scriptural precepts, intrinsic justice, Jewish customs, and Christ's command (1 Corinthians 9:3-14). Yet, despite these valid claims, he willingly surrenders his rights because his ultimate goal is to share the gospel effectively. For him, his reward comes from preaching the gospel, a task he sees not as an obligation but as a calling (1 Corinthians 9:16-18). His willingness to surrender his rights arises from a deep desire to win souls for the Lord and an understanding of the gospel's power to transform lives.

Surrendering our rights for the gospel changes everything. It fosters a deep well of knowledge that overflows into love and compassion. When the gospel is our foundation, we willingly set aside personal rights for the sake of others. We become attuned to the needs of those around us, reflecting the sacrificial love of Christ for us on the cross. It is not merely about what we gain but what we can give – sharing the transformative power of the gospel, the greatest gift one can ever receive!
