In a courtroom, the goal is to find out the truth. In life, we too want to know what's true, but the question is: can we handle it? The wonderful thing about the Bible is that when it comes to bad news, we also see the good news of the gospel, as Jesus Himself was described as full of grace and truth. But are we guilty or not guilty under God's laws?

Judgment Day (Romans 2:5-13)

Our salvation is by faith, but the judgment of believers will be according to deeds. We are saved by faith, not by works. Our good works is not a means to salvation, rather is it an outflow or the evidence of our salvation (Ephesians 2:8-10). The reality is that we cannot stand before God or enter heaven on account of our goodness. In Romans 2:11-13, Paul was addressing both the Jews and the Gentiles. Paul addressed the Gentiles as those "without the law". In today's context, they are whom we call "moralists". The Gentiles are those who live by their conscience, not the Bible; while the Jews are those who are "under the law". In today's context, they are those who are "under the law". Their defense is in how they faithfully practice their religion.

Defense #1: "I live a good life!" (Romans 2:14-16)

The Gentiles are those who instinctively live a good and moral life. Their basis for their actions is their conscience, but does having a good conscience bring us to heaven? The dictionary definition for conscience is "an inner feeling or voice viewed as acting as a guide to the rightness or wrongness of one's behavior." HELP Word Studies defined conscience as "a spiritual or moral consciousness that is a result of having been created in God's image, and therefore unique to human beings." If we were to be judged by our conscience, we will be accountable for two things: first, if we knew what was right or wrong; and secondly, if we did what was right after knowing what was right and wrong. In most cases, we would fail.

Defense #2: "I practice my religion!" (Romans 2:17-29)

Paul reminds us that our religiosity is not the basis for salvation. If following the Law would be the basis of our salvation then we should be able to follow it perfectly all the time, to which we are sure to fall short. In Romans 2:25-27, Paul talks about circumcision which was sacred to the Jews. Paul said that if they were only focused on the outward act of circumcision, they were missing the point! In the Old Testament, God says that He will circumcise the hearts of His people — the outward ceremony is just a symbol of an inward transformation that can only take place in a personal relationship with God. We know that change has taken place in our hearts by the Holy Spirit when we no longer seek the praise of men but the approval of God.

The Mercy of the Court

We are all guilty and our only recourse is to throw ourselves at the mercy of the court (Romans 3:9). We need to fall and plead for God's mercy for regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:4-5). How did God set this in motion for us? In a courtroom 2,000 years ago, Pilate released Barabbas, and Jesus went to the cross (Matthew 27:26). He took the sin of Barabbas to the cross, the same way that He also took your sin and mine to the cross. Because of Christ's sacrifice, we are now declared not guilty (2 Corinthians 5:21).

Today, if you are a follower of Christ, be humble. Don't look down on others and remember that you are saved only by grace. Go the extra mile and tell others about Jesus. And if you're not yet a follower of Christ, stop making excuses and stop relying on your morals and religion for salvation. Take that step of faith today and surrender your life to Jesus Christ.
