WHEN LOVE IS HARD

LAST WEEK'S MESSAGE

Living the full life is so counterintuitive, especially for followers of Christ. The focus is not on self, but on others. In John 13:34-35, Jesus commands His disciples to LOVE ONE ANOTHER because this is the mark of a true believer and follower of Christ. His heart's prayer is for all of God's children to have unity regardless of differences so that others would believe Him by their words, deeds, and love for one another (John 17:20-21). But WHEN LOVE IS HARD, what do we do? In Romans Chapter 14, we see three steps we can take to love people even when it's difficult.

ACCEPT (ROMANS 14:1-6)

The Roman church was a mixture of Jewish and Gentile believers who came from different backgrounds with their own set of traditions and habits that they carried into their Christian life. The apostle Paul reminds the Roman believers to accept one another and not treat each other with contempt for individual differences, such as not eating certain food or for considering certain days more sacred than others. This is because all of them have been received and accepted by God. God is at work in all His children's lives, and He will complete the work He started in them. Changing people is God's department, not ours.

Biblical acceptance is loving and respecting the person as is, where is. It is not embracing values or lifestyle choices that are against the word and will of God. This tells us that there are "ESSENTIAL" truths about our faith that we must agree on completely without compromise such as salvation through faith, the deity of Jesus, and the authority God's Word. And then there are the "NON-ESSENTIAL" things that the Bible does not speak clearly on where we can have more liberty of opinions such as when Jesus will come, style of worship, stand on healing, baptism, and day of Sabbath. We are not to fight over the "non-essentials". Our part is to do all things for the Lord, accept others, and trust in Him to move in our lives and those around us.

ABSTAIN FROM JUDGING (ROMANS 14:7-12)

As we are God's followers, we are His responsibility. This truth, while very comforting, also requires us to be very careful in how we live. One day, we will stand before the judgment seat of God. He will hold us accountable. It is in light of this truth that Paul urges the Roman believers not to judge each other. 1 Corinthians 4:5 tells us who the real Judge is – it is God, the only One who sees the minds and hearts of people. Today, we judge each other in many ways, like when we listen to only one side of the story or judge a person's motives by their actions and behavior. Rather than judging others which promotes division, we are to do our part to try to understand each other, clarify issues, and initiate reconciliation.

AVOID BEING A STUMBLING BLOCK (ROMANS 14:13-18)

Paul gives us a clear command not to put a stumbling block or an obstacle along the path of fellow believers. If something we do would make others stumble, we must limit our freedom to engage in such activity so that these still-growing Christians will not stumble. In our hearts we say, "Others may, but I will not"; "I limit my liberty for the sake of God's kingdom"; "I must be responsible for my brothers". Jesus warns us in Matthew 18:6 that if we cause someone to stumble, for example by living a life of hypocrisy, we destroy someone else's walk. We must live our life in such a way that it builds others up and draws them even closer to God.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

What do you usually do when you find it hard to love someone? Have you ever been a stumbling block to someone? How did you resolve the matter? What should you START and STOP doing?
