



FROM THE GROUND FLOOR LOBBY


Doors to the Multi-Purpose Hall are found to the left and right sides of the front desk.

FROM THE GROUND FLOOR LOBBY


Glass doors to the Social Hall and the Bible Study Rooms are found to the left of the front desk, past the escalator.





LOWER BALCONY LEVEL



Reverend Edmund Chan is a seasoned disciple-making pastor. The Leadership Mentor in Covenant Evangelical Free Church, Edmund is widely regarded as an insightful Bible expositor and a wise mentor of Christian leaders.

He is the Founder of the Global Alliance of Intentional Disciple-making Churches. For over two decades he has been well known, locally and overseas, for his expository preaching and his mentoring of Christian leaders.

Dr. Peter Tan-Chi is a self-supporting pastor and founder of Christ's Commission Fellowship (CCF), a discipleship church planting movement focused on mobilizing business and lay men and women. Today, CCF has become a worldwide discipleship movement that has grown to over 16,000 small groups and over 190,000 members in the Philippines alone. It has helped establish 35,000 house churches and satellites in other parts of the world including North America, Australia, the Middle East, and Asia.

Peter is also a successful businessman and entrepreneur. He is the Founder and Chairman of Axeia Development

Corporation, one of the pioneer and leading mass housing and subdivision developers in the Philippines. He is involved in other businesses, such as real estate development and education.

With his passion for the family, he and his wife, Deonna, co-authored the book "Motivate! 8 Secrets of Successful Parenting". They regularly speak at international conferences on topics including marriage, parenting, and growing healthy churches.

They have been blessed with five children who are happily married and twenty-four grandchildren.

RECLAIMING GOD'S DESIGN IN THE FAMILY

DANNY URQUICO'S TESTIMONY ON ABANDONMENT

I grew up in a broken family. My father, who was part of the "Big 4," was imprisoned for 15 years. After his release, he stayed with us for only a few years before leaving with his mistress. I harbored deep hatred toward my father—not only because he abandoned us, but also because he verbally and physically abused our family.

That hatred led me into a rebellious life. I learned to smoke at the age of nine, drank alcohol at ten, and by eleven, I was already smoking marijuana and abusing cough syrup. I was constantly in and out of schools and police stations because of fistfights. I became addicted to shabu for several years, got involved in murder, appeared on the front page of a newspaper for gang rape, and was jailed in San Juan for carjacking and robbery—all by the age of seventeen.


I also survived two major car accidents and three separate shooting incidents. My anger and bitterness grew so deep that I even desired to kill my own father. Things worsened when I got my girlfriend pregnant at eighteen. After five years of living together, she became my wife. Sadly, just like my father, I maintained multiple

relationships at the same time. I was an unfaithful husband, an irresponsible provider, and a careless father.

I hated my father for what he did to us, yet the irony was that I ended up following in his footsteps. I eventually left my wife and our two children. At my lowest point, because of drugs and rage, I even attempted to kill my own family when my wife refused my proposed annulment. I also attempted to commit suicide twice. When those attempts failed, I decided to stay in Laurel, Batangas.

After a year, I got involved in another shooting incident where I nearly killed my neighbor and his family. They filed a case of frustrated homicide against me, and an arrest warrant was issued. I immediately informed my wife, and she fetched me right away. This painful situation became an unexpected opportunity for reconciliation because I had nowhere else to go. I posted bail for temporary liberty. Despite everything, my wife continued to show me unconditional love. She never brought up the pain and suffering I had caused her. Instead, she consistently invited me to attend church.

Because of her kindness, I was encouraged to join a small group and



attend Sunday services. Everything began to change in January 2001 when I attended the Dawn Watch with my wife. On that very first attendance, I felt the Holy Spirit touch my life. I surrendered my life to God and accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior.

That same day, I lost all desire to smoke, drink, or use prohibited drugs. From then on, I stopped womanizing and no longer went out drinking with friends. All I wanted was to be with my family or attend Bible studies, Sunday services, and Dawn Watch. Bible reading and prayer became my priority—and eventually, my lifestyle. I experienced peace in my heart, harmony in my family, and a deep passion to love and serve God.

I continued to grow in my newfound relationship with the Lord. Soon after, God led me to minister to young people and prisoners. In 2005, I became a full-

time youth pastor. Three years later, I became the pastor of CCF Taytay. And 5 years later, I became the regional pastor of Metro East.

As for my father, I praise God that he, too, surrendered his life to Jesus on his deathbed. God is truly gracious.

My name is Danny Urquico—a husband to a godly and forgiving wife, Dawn, and a father to three wonderful children. I am a recipient of God's grace, and a passionate and compassionate servant of our Lord Jesus Christ.

SHEN PALILLO BLAQUERA'S TESTIMONY ON GENDER CONFUSION


I experienced sexual abuse during my childhood, which is one of the reasons I've found safety and connection in same-sex relationships more. I was exposed to same sex attraction during highschool and had a same sex relationship in college. When my mother learned about this, she did everything she can to separate us. Gradually, my relationship with my mother fell apart. We lived in one house but for her it was as if I didn't exist. No more care, no more talking, no more trust. I didn't feel the love of a mother anymore, only hate and anger. I often asked myself, "Why she can't accept me? If she truly loves me, she should accept me for who I am." Suicidal thoughts were always present because of the pain I felt. This led me to a decision to move out from our house, move in with my then-partner, and completely disconnect from my family. I thought I would be happy since I was with the person I wanted to be with. But in my heart, I wasn't truly happy. I was lost and seeking something more.

Jeremiah 29:11 says "'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'"

In October 2012, everything changed. My mother had an accident, and while I was taking care of her in the hospital, my partner was with someone else. It was a painful and defining moment that made me realize I needed to leave that 12-year relationship. It was during this difficult time that I reconnected with Paul. He knew my story and what happened to me that time. I initially invited him to accompany me to attend a mass, but instead he invited me to go to his church. I'll never forget that first service.

During worship, I was overwhelmed with emotion and felt God speaking directly to my heart. He comforted me, and in that moment, I felt peace I had never known. I knew I needed to keep coming back. Eventually, I surrendered my life to Jesus, and my life was completely transformed.

I continuously attended weekly service then eventually join a discipleship group. I also started doing my daily devotions and eventually attended a retreat where I declared my surrender and acceptance of Jesus as my Lord and Savior. From there, I have participated in different ministries like giving out gospel tracts, food, and Bibles in Baywalk, and attended multiple conferences and trainings to



deepen my knowledge and relationship with Jesus. Paul and I then got into a relationship, then got married 2 years later. Before our wedding, I had the opportunity to ask my parents for forgiveness. In seeking to honor them, our relationship was finally restored.

Eventually, God blessed Paul and I with 2 wonderful kids who serve with us in ministry. We continue to participate in ministries together and attend conferences like Counterflow and IDC. We also partnered with an NGO and gave away food and medicines, led the youth group in a local church, led a couples discipleship group, and even organized and participated in church events in a CCF satellite. As a family, we actively volunteer in couples retreats and family retreats. We also hold Bible studies with Paul's family.

I joined Women Living Free to learn how to communicate more with the LGBTQ+ community, and now I serve as one of the admins. Through WLF, I am able to

help mothers restore and have good relationships with their daughters who are going through the same struggles. I was also blessed to be able to share my story in other ministries such as Life to the Max and Women2Women.

Romans 8:28 says, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. I believe God allowed my mother's accident so that He can free me from the bondage of sin. He allowed me to feel unexplainable pain so that I can have the courage to leave my ex-partner. And God chose Paul to be my husband so that I can have my dream family and feel all of His love through them. All of the pain and trials in my past are now a blessing in my life. I am Shen Palillo Blaquera and this is God's story in my life. All praises and glory to the author of our life!

RECLAIMING GOD'S DESIGN IN THE FAMILY

UJ AND CAMILLE YAMBAO'S TESTIMONY ON SOLO PARENTING AND BLENDED FAMILIES

VJ: Camille and I have been married since January 2017. Before exchanging I do's, we were already parents to Ice, my son from a previous relationship who was born out of wedlock when I was only 17 years old, while Camille had Nathan from her late husband who passed away due to cancer last 2011.

Camille: When I became a widow at 26, I vowed never to remarry again. I knew from experience that marriage is very hard to navigate, and my mind was set that I would remain a single mom. Moving forward, all I wanted was to give Nathan a good life as I raised him on my own.

VJ: The mom of Ice and I were trying our best to fix our issues. Although we weren't married, we were trying to stay together for Ice. Eventually, the relationship came to an end, but we continued to be co-parents to Ice.

Some time after, Camille and I reconnected back in the Philippines. We had been grade school classmates, and hadn't seen each other in 20 years! Since we both had struggles and challenges from our previous relationships, we found comfort in each other.

Camille: When we got married last 2017, we became just like any typical blended family. Nathan was 5 years old when he met VJ. Naturally, he took him as his father. I, on the other hand, had always been Tita Camille to Ice, even after VJ and I got married in 2017.

Ice continued to live with his mom and would occasionally visit us on weekends, and from time to time join us on vacations.


VJ: Ice's mom and I struggled with co-parenting, we would always get into an awkward conversation that led to friction. I wasn't fully aware that this had a negative effect on Ice. He was aware that his mom and dad, who now had their own set of families, couldn't keep a good relationship for him.

I felt like I was caught in between. I sensed that keeping an open communication with Ice's mom made Camille feel uncomfortable and resentful.

Camille: I never realized how selfish I was at that time. I continually struggled with jealousy in my heart and even though I tried my best not to show it. VJ and I had a lot of stress in our marriage over "co-parenting."

It was during the pandemic when VJ and I had a spiritual turning point. We became serious in seeking God, and really surrendered our lives to Jesus. This was when God really spoke to my heart. He dealt with what I had pushed back. I heard Him clearly say, "Camille I know that you have been diligently studying My Word and doing the best you can to obey, but really, if you are to be honest with yourself, how is your family life?"

I knew right away what God meant. He was talking to me about Ice, VJ's son, and our "co-parenting."



God made me reflect on how this relationship could be so much better if I changed my heart and my perspective — that there is a godly version of this blended family.

I prayed that God would open up my heart to wholeheartedly accept the realities of our marriage and family.

VJ: Around April of 2022, we finally moved into our home which God blessed us with. By then, we had 4 kids. God gave us two more children, Nala and Nolan. I would tell Camille that I would really like it if Ice also came to live with us. I missed so much of his growing up years and I wanted to have an opportunity to be with him especially since we had a place to call our home.

Camille: God knew I was struggling with submitting to VJ in this area, but I also knew by this time that I had to surrender and obey in order for God to truly work in our lives. God impressed upon me to reach out to the mom of Ice. At first, I couldn't bring myself to do it because of pride. But I trusted that God had bigger plans and so I chose to obey.

I reached out to her and asked for forgiveness for all the hurts and pains that I might have caused her the past 10 years. I told her that I sincerely wanted to have a good and amicable co-parenting relationship with her and her husband. To my surprise, she replied and said that this was something she had been praying for!

After 10 years of not getting along and not liking each other, this conversation was made possible by God and no one else. He alone can change hearts.

Around May of 2022, a month since Ice moved in with us, the kids gave me mother's day letters as a gift, including Ice. He said so many heartwarming things and at the end of it he wrote,

"My mama said that you really love me, I don't know why I still don't call you mom, but starting today I will. Happy Mother's day Mom."

God showed me what I had missed all along — to be able to receive a love so pure and real from Ice, from someone who isn't really my own. It was a love so special unlike any other, a love that can only be made whole by God alone.

VJ: This was indeed an answered prayer for me. To finally have Camille and our 4 kids, everyone I love in one house, without having to worry about any resistance between them. God made what I thought was hopeless and impossible to be possible.

As Camille and I sought God together in our marriage, we became intentional in leading our family by having a regular schedule of studying the Word with them. We also make sure that we spend quality time with all of our 4 children.

As a father, I am grateful to see how my wife supports and trusts me in leading our family. This has been one of the biggest changes I have seen in Camille as we live out His design for our family.

As our family's God-appointed leader, I pray that we will continue to seek Him, and that His grace and wisdom will be upon us, as we all strive with His grace, to live a purposeful life that is pleasing to Him. To God be all praise and glory!
