Reaching the Unreached One Home at a Time

Modelled after the early church, a Home Fellowship is a community of believers living in proximity with one another, who regularly gather in homes. It is a disciple-making church that cultivates Christ-centered relationships, studies God's Word, grows in Christlikeness, lovingly serves and supports one another, and intentionally reaches the unreached out of love for God and others.

how to start, grow and expand a home fellowship

ENGAGE

Connect with the Community

- Pray for God's leading and wisdom.
- Host a simple bridging event, such as a topical Bible study (e.g., parenting and financial stewardship), movie watching, or Matthew party. Use engage videos found in the GLC website.
- Connect with the people in your area through Pray, Care, Share.

EDIFY

Build Relationships

Hold weekly gatherings to watch CCF's Run through messages. The process for the weekly gatherings of a home fellowship is composed of 3Ms:

- **Mag-invite (Invite)** Encourage attendees to invite their family and friends—each one, reach one.
- **Manood (Watch Together)** Play the video of a CCF Sunday Run through message. You may also play videos of CCF praise and worship songs before the Run through message. (Note: Use videos instead of live speakers. You only need basic equipment, such as LED TV, laptop, and USB drive).
- **Magkuwentuhan (Conversation)** Assign attendees to breakout groups. The members of your team will serve as facilitators initially, but later, homegrown Dgroup leaders will serve as facilitators.
- Form breakout groups to discuss the message. Eventually, these breakout groups could become Dgroups.
- By the end of your activity, excite them with the possibility of meeting weekly.

EQUIP

Develop Leaders

- Identify homegrown Dgroup leaders.
- Train members to become volunteers, potential Dgroup leaders, and home fellowship planters. Conduct GLC training:
- Core Trainings: How to share the Gospel (Book 2); CCF DNA (Book 4); Starting Line (all videos and workbooks in the GLC website) and how to start the HF using the 4 E's process.

EMPOWER

Multiply Home Fellowships

- Train Leaders to Multiply by conducting GLC Book 9: The Multiplier.
- Mentor potential home fellowship leaders, and then send them out to start new home fellowships.
- Aim for exponential multiplication in your area.

Note: For a full training in leadership development, encourage members to go through GLC Books 1-12.
