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SHARING THE GOSPEL AS A WAY OF LIFE

INTRODUCTION:

The *Evangelifestyle workshop* teaches that sharing the gospel is not just an event, but a way of life—rooted in Jesus’ command and God’s heart for the lost. It presents a simple and practical approach—**Pray, Care, Share**—along with tools like sharing your personal testimony and the gospel clearly. Through biblical examples and practical steps, this workshop helps believers grow in confidence and live out a lifestyle of intentional evangelism.

LEARNING NUGGET

What often holds us back from sharing the gospel is not ability, but fear. God does not call us to be perfect—He calls us to be available. The *Evangelifestyle workshop* is designed to help us take simple, practical steps in sharing our faith. As we step out in obedience, the Holy Spirit works through us to impact lives.

TALK ABOUT IT

I. Why We Must Live Evangelifestyle?

II. CCF's EVANGELISM STRATEGY

Pray-Care-Share: A simple pathway for sharing the gospel as you go about life!



A. PRAY

1. Pray for divine _____.
2. Pray for _____ and pray with _____.
Ask, "How can I pray for you?"

B. CARE – demonstrate real concern

1. Make every effort to see people and think about their situation, empathize with them, and find ways to help them.
2. Look for opportunities to intentionally care for them — for example, be a listening ear, spend time with them, do acts of kindness.
3. Ask for updates on how God is answering their prayer requests.

C. SHARE

Share your own story and the gospel in 3 steps.



STEP 1: START A CONVERSATION

- _____ questions about what they believe to understand them and help break down barriers that keep them from knowing Jesus.
- _____ something about your friend's belief. Don't affirm their sin or things that aren't true but acknowledge their answer. Find areas of common ground.
- _____ your inadequacies to serve as transition to why you want to talk about Jesus.

Transition to sharing your 1-minute testimony at this point.

ASK people **open ended questions** about what they believe, not to trap them, but to understand them and break down any relational barriers keeping them from considering Jesus.

1. How would you describe your spiritual journey?
2. On a scale of 1 to 10—where 10 means you are sure you will go to heaven and 1 means you are not—where would you place yourself?
3. If there was a way to be sure, would you like to know?

• SAMPLE TESTIMONY OF PAUL

• STYLE OF JESUS

John 4:14

“But whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life.”

Jesus demonstrated how to naturally turn everyday conversations into opportunities to share the gospel. In His encounter with the Samaritan woman in John 4, He began with a simple, situational question that captured her attention despite cultural barriers. He then used a relatable analogy—physical water and “living water”—to point to eternal life, smoothly transitioning the conversation toward spiritual truth.

⁷ There came a woman of Samaria to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give Me a drink.”

⁹ Therefore the Samaritan woman said to Him, “How is it that You, being a Jew, ask me for a drink since I am a Samaritan woman?” (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.)

John 4:10-11, 13-20

¹⁰ Jesus answered and said to her, “If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, ‘Give Me a drink,’ you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.”

¹¹ She said to Him, “Sir, You have nothing to draw with and the well is deep; where then do You get that living water?”

¹³ Jesus answered and said to her, “Everyone who drinks of this water will thirst again; ¹⁴ but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall never thirst; but the water that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life.”

¹⁵ The woman said to Him, “Sir, give me this water, so I will not be thirsty nor come all the way here to draw.” ¹⁶ He said to her, “Go, call your husband and come here.”

¹⁷ The woman answered and said, “I have no husband.” Jesus said to her, “You have correctly said, ‘I have no husband’;

¹⁸ for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; this you have said truly.”

¹⁹ The woman said to Him, “Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshiped in this mountain, and you *people* say that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship.”

²⁵ The woman said to Him, “I know that Messiah is coming (He who is called Christ); when that One comes, He will declare all things to us.” ²⁶ Jesus said to her, “I who speak to you am *He*.”

¹⁶ Now while Paul was waiting for them at Athens, his spirit was being provoked within him as he was observing the city full of idols. ¹⁷ So he was reasoning **in the synagogue** with the Jews and the God-fearing Gentiles, and **in the market** place every day with those who happened to be present. ¹⁸ And also some of the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers were conversing with him. Some were saying, “What would this idle babbler wish to say?” Others, “He seems to be a proclaimer of strange deities,”—**because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection.**

²² So Paul stood in the midst of the Areopagus and said, “Men of Athens, **I observe that you are very religious in all respects.**

STEP 3: SHARE THE GOSPEL

Use the “Best Decision” booklet.

Transition from your story to the Best Decision gospel presentation.

Success in Witnessing is taking the initiative to share the gospel clearly in the power of the Holy Spirit and leaving the results to God.

If the person says they are **not yet ready to accept Jesus**, respond gently:

- “Let me show you what will happen when you do invite Christ into your life.”

• Go to the promises section:

- Explain using **future tense** (what will happen when they accept Christ)
- Do **not** read the “spiritual birthday” line

• Address understanding:

- Some may hesitate because they don’t fully understand
- The promises can help answer their questions or concerns

• Invite again:

- After explaining, ask if they would like to accept Christ

• If YES:

- Go back to the acceptance prayer
- Pray with them

• If NO:

- Respect their decision
- Say something like:
 - “I respect your decision. If you’re ready in the future, you know how.”
- Thank them for the conversation
- Leave the booklet so they can review it later

IV. NEXT ACTION STEPS

- MEMORIZE the main outline and verses under each truth in the best decision booklet.
- SHARE THE GOSPEL TO 1 PERSON IN THE NEXT 3 DAYS.
- Pick a PRAY CARE SHARE Day of the Week and Call it “E-DAY”
- Follow up appointment is crucial
- CONNECT to a small group

V. EXTRA TIPS AND EXAMPLES IN CONVERSATION

- Remember ask questions to know their beliefs and background
- Show you care
- Do not be defensive
- Do not take offense
- Remember only the Holy Spirit can transform the heart
- We are only instruments

B. SHARE TIPS

In addition to using your testimony to transition to the gospel, here are other ways to turn any conversation with anyone to the gospel:

1. Ask questions relevant to the person's situation/need that will help you find a starting point for connecting better with that person.
2. Transition any conversation into a spiritual theme; paving the way for the gospel to be shared to anyone you are talking to.

Sample conversation topics leading towards the gospel

- **When conversing about relationships**

"Do you consider your relationship with your (friend/parents/spouse) to be your most important relationship right now? Why?"
"I realized that there have been many significant relationships in my life. But I've discovered one relationship that has become more and more important to me as time goes by. I'm talking about my relationship with Jesus Christ. Can I tell you more about it?"

"I learned that God loves us and desires for us to experience a full and meaningful life. May I share more about it with you?"

- **During a conversation about school or career goals.**

"What do you think is the best way to achieve your school/career goals?"

"Believe it or not, the Bible gives us assurance that God wants to prosper us and give us a hopeful future. It says in Jeremiah 29:11... 'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'"

- **When you're talking to someone who is in pain.**

People who are hurting are usually more sensitive to God, and this is a good time to turn your conversation to the gospel. Try asking questions like:

"Who are you able to talk to about what you're feeling right now?"

"You might know this already, but I would like to let you know again that God is here for you. He loves you and has a perfect plan that He is working out even in your situation right now. Sometimes when I'm hurting, it's hard to believe that. But will you allow me to tell you more about God's love and plan for you?"

Your goal is to transition smoothly in and out of a topic by merely asking a question or offering another perspective on the topic at hand.

C. GOSPEL SHARE BANNER

GospelShare Banner

Upon login to the CCF mobile app, you will see the GospelShare section in the homepage.

The GospelShare banner displays the number of times the gospel is shared today.

When you tap the banner, you will be taken to another page that displays detailed information about this number.

GospelShare Dashboard

The dashboard displays 4 numbers.

- Total churchwide shares – number of gospel shares churchwide from the day the campaign started.
- Today's churchwide shares – number of gospel shares churchwide just for the current day.
- Your total shares – number of gospel shares by you from the day the campaign started
- Your today's shares – number of gospel share by you just for the current day.

GospelShare update button

Tap the “Yes! Gospel shared today!” button to update your today’s shares/total shares. You will be taken to another page.

Once you tap this button, you will be taken to another page. Here, just use the +/- button to input how many times you shared the gospel today. Once the number is correct, tap submit.

You will be taken to another page prompting you that you successfully updated the GospelShare count in the dashboard. This comes with an encouraging message and a verse. You can tap the “x” icon to exit this view.

You will return to the homepage and see that the count for “Today’s Shares” has been updated as well.
